The yarn is acrylic from Red Heart (a big yarn company for those of you who don't yarn). There are lots of different colors to use and the pattern is interesting to work due to the changes in colors and in the stitches.

His comments ranged from "looks like a lot of work", to "that will take a long time", to "what are you going to do with it?" and variations of those three. The last became a frequent query.
